The Itasca County Sharing Fund

The Itasca County Sharing Fund is designed to provide crisis funding for residents of the Sharing Fund Service Area.

The Itasca County Sharing Fund Service Area is designated as Itasca County; including the Hill City and Nashwauk-Keewatin areas.

Crisis funding is for basic life-sustaining need items (food, shelter, clothing and health needs) and basic well-being and human dignity needs (transportation, employment and workforce issues) that are not available from other sources.

GRACF follows specific priorities in determining the approval of a Sharing Fund grant.

Priority 1: Basic life-sustaining needs

Priority 2: Well-being and human dignity needs

Requests can only be made by an approved agency.

A Sharing Fund Agency is defined as a nonprofit or not-for-profit organization that is designed to improve the life and well-being of individuals and families in the Sharing Fund service area.

Examples include: health and human service agencies, churches, schools, sheriff, police, fire and paramedic units

The Sharing Fund cannot justify supporting grants that are not critical or crisis in nature.
